What are the benefits for you as a student?

- → Receive on-site experience with a workplace mentor.

- → Earn pay aligned with your knowledge and skills. (So, the more you learn, the more you get paid.)

What do I have to do?

- → Be 16 years of age.
- → Maintain a minimum of a "C" average.
- → Be available for a morning or afternoon work schedule.
- → Put in 15 to 24 hours per week at the worksite.
- → Possess a strong work ethic.
- → Visit your counselor's office for program and enrollment information.
- → Contact the Apprenticeship Coordinator to complete the application process.
