Writing in the Content Areas

All students, K-5, will show growth in their writing through common grade level writing prompts. Students will be scored using a common rubric, and teachers will use weekly collaborative planning to analyze student writing and share best practices. Writing will be used pervasively and consistently throughout the school as the vehicle for improving student achievement and assessing higher level thinking for all students in all content areas.

SD: Archer Cluster Vertical Team

Assistant principals and teachers in each content area will participate in vertical cluster meetings several times throughout the year.

Participants will continue to evaluate cluster data in order to seek strategies to close the achievement gap. The focus on DBQs and writing throughout the grade levels and content areas will drive the work.

SD: Effective Strategies for Reaching All Learners

Teachers will choose from four possible staff development sessions to attend once per month during the school year. Session 1 will focus on strategies for gifted and ELL students. Session 2 will focus on differentiation. Session 3 will focus on mimios and technology, and session 4 will be on strategies for the new science resources. These four sessions will allow staff to select an area of need and concentrate on learning how to use the new strategies to meet the goal of improving student thinking and problem solving, and therefore, student achievement.

SD: MATH INSTITUTE - ELEMENTARY

The Math Institute provides effective professional learning through modeling by "master" teachers, peer coaching, and debriefing discussions. Following the summer workshop, ongoing mentoring and implementing of best practices should be evident.

SD: SUMMER LITERACY INSTITUTE

An intensive course in the theory and practice of Readers' and Writers' Workshop in K-12 language arts and literacy strategies for math, science, and social studies.
