**c** 88.875 is the total Grade Percent Average earned for first semester. The cumulative Grade Point Average is 3.375. (Uses a scale of A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1, F=0.) This student's grades on this 4-point scale totaled 27 points, divided by eight classes, for a 3.375 GPA.

**d** 90.000 is the total Grade Percent Average earned for second semester. The cumulative GPA (the average of all of the course GPAs) for this student now is up to 3.5 (49 points divided by 14 classes).

**\* Did you know?** While an 89 is only one percentage point from a 90, the 89 counts as a "3" toward the student's cumulative GPA, but the 90 counts as "4". Challenge yourself to do your best. Your extra effort can make a big difference. See page 5 for more about understanding grades.
